**Availability:**

- Location of internship: Anderson and Pickens Counties
- Approximate dates of internship: May-August
- Preferred days of the week: Monday – Thursday
- Preferred hours: 9 am to 5 pm – Intern must commit to a minimum of 5 hours per week

**Preferred degree program:**

- Students currently enrolled in Bachelor's degree program or rising HS senior
- With a concentration or focus in: Communication, Graphic Design, Marketing, Public Relations, Hospitality, Recreation, Event Management, Nonprofit Management or a related field.

**Description of internship position:**

The student will work with the Executive Director and board of ANTR to plan and execute summer activities for children with disabilities and children living in the foster care system in Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens counties.

**Duties Include:**

- **Playdates:** Scheduling, planning, and managing logistics of playdates and parent meet-ups over the summer.
- **Arts Camp:** Assist with the management, planning, and logistics of a week-long half day performing arts camp for children and young adults with disabilities. Camp dates TBD.
- **Sports Camp:** Assist with the management, planning, and logistics of a week-long introductory sports camp for children with disabilities. Camp dates TBD.
- **Communications:** Assist with the creation of promotional materials for summer events/activities, website & social media management, and communicating with families of participants.

### Camp Specific Information:

**Arts Camp:** Camp will run Monday - Friday for approximately three hours each day. Areas of focus will include drama, dance, music, and arts & crafts. A curriculum is available with the option to customize our materials. There will be a performance on the last day of camp. The number of participants will be limited. Volunteers will be utilized to staff each station. The intern will be responsible for assisting with acquiring, training, and managing volunteers, as well as, the planning and logistics of camp. The intern will receive a stipend. The intern should anticipate working approximately 40 hours total over the course of the summer. Aside from camp week, the days and hours of work are flexible.

**Sports Camp:** Camp will run Monday-Friday for approximately one and a half hours each evening. Areas of focus will be basketball, baseball, and soccer. The program will be offered to participants ages three years and up with disabilities. Participants will rotate through stations that will teach basic skills for each sport. Participants will be paired with a volunteer to assist them with each activity. The number of participants will be limited. The intern will be responsible for assisting with acquiring, training, and managing volunteers, as well as, the planning and logistics of camp. The intern will receive a stipend. The intern should anticipate working approximately 30 hours total over the course of the summer. Aside from camp week, the days and hours of work are flexible.
